OUR FOUNDERS

Husband and wife team David and Susan Havens founded Spare for Change in 2011 to make a difference in golf.

David Havens, PGA, was raised in humble surroundings in southwest Virginia. He first picked up a golf club as a young man, and the game of golf changed his life. Golf became a vehicle that propelled him to excel in his studies, play golf for Virginia Tech, and travel the world, including professional play in Zimbabwe, South Africa, and across Australia and Canada.

David moved to Maui in 2004 to begin his golf career in Hawaii. He was selected as the Aloha Section PGA Golf Professional of the Year in 2017, and Aloha Section PGA Teacher of the Year in 2013.

Susan's passion for golf began at the age of 10 in Indiana. After graduating from Purdue University, she moved to Maui where she met David. The pair had their first date at the Manele Golf Course on the island of Lanai.

The Havens operate Spare for Change from Maui, where they reside with their children, Savannah and Jackson.
